
4:00 - 5:00 CALIFORNIA BOOKSTORE DAY RECEPTION

DIRECTIONS TO NCIBA SPRING GATHERING

If you've ever been to the NCIBA offices in the Presidio, you've been to the Thoreau Center -- it's the building that houses us. These directions will get you to the Thoreau Center's main parking lot at the back of the building, where you will be entering for the event -- don't come to our back door as it will be locked. If you have any problem finding us that morning, our cell phone # is 415-317-2409.

NOTE: There is now a \$7 parking charge on Sundays - sorry! Cash or credit card.

FROM EAST BAY

Take first Bay Bridge exit on the right -- Fremont Street. At bottom of exit, turn left onto Fremont. Cross Market Street and make almost immediate left turn onto Pine Street. Take Pine all the way up to Presidio (four blocks after Divisadero), then turn right. Take Presidio to the Presidio Gate park entrance. See below for directions in the park.

FROM SOUTH BAY

Come into San Francisco on 280 and follow signs for 19th Avenue and/or Golden Gate Bridge. Take 19th Avenue through Golden Gate Park -- on the other side of the park, you are now on Park Presidio. Go to California Street and turn right. You can continue on California to Arguello or (about 10 blocks later) Presidio. In either case, turn left and go to park entrance. See below for directions from Presidio Gate.

From Arguello Gate, follow the road as it winds down into the park. You will come to an open area known as the Main Post, where Arguello ends. Turn right, then make an immediate left onto Graham Street. Go down Graham to Lincoln (4-way stop), then right. After about two blocks, you will see a left turn lane (the large YMCA parking lot will be on your right). Make that left onto Girard. The road goes straight, then curves to the right after about a block -- take the right and continue to the large parking lot on your right. Turn into the parking lot and park. **The entrance you want is at the top left corner of the lot.**

FROM MARIN

Off the Golden Gate Bridge, follow signs to Lombard Street. Take Lombard exit and get into right lane. There is a right turn exit into the Presidio, before you get to the first set of stop lights at Lyon and Francisco. Take the exit, which curves right onto Gorgas (the YMCA/Letterman Pool will be on your right). Take Gorgas to O'Reilly, turn left one block, then right on Edie. Go two blocks to parking lot. Turn into the parking lot and park. **The entrance is at the top left corner of the lot.**

From Presidio Gate:

Come down Presidio into the Park. The first stop sign will be Lombard intersection. Continue straight. At the next stop sign, Presidio turns into Lincoln -- stay straight. Within about a block, you will see a narrow street on your right named Girard -- turn right onto Girard. The road goes straight, then curves to the right after about a block -- take the right and continue to the large parking lot on your right. Turn into the parking lot and park. **The entrance is at the top left corner of the lot.**
